

pH 1-6	pH 7	pH 8-14
Acids are substances that produce hydrogen ions (H^+) when dissolved in water.	A neutral substance is a substance that is neither acidic nor basic. It has a pH value of 7.	Bases are substances that neutralise acids to form salt and water. Alkalis are bases that dissolve in water.
Turns blue litmus paper red.	Does not alter the colour of red or blue litmus paper.	Turns red litmus paper blue.
